

POSITION TITLE: Postdoctoral Research Associate

GENERAL SUMMARY: The Mace Lab in the Department of Chemistry at Tufts University (macelab.org) seeks a postdoctoral research associate whose primary responsibilities will be to lead the development of paper-based microfluidic devices that facilitate *in situ* sample processing to improve the quantitation of analytes from complex sample matrices.

The candidate should have a strong background in separation science and traditional analytical instrumentation with a specific emphasis on liquid chromatography and mass spectrometry. Preference will be given to those candidates having (i) previous experience using human blood or other complex sample matrices, and (ii) operational understanding of, or familiarity with, microfluidics, device design, and materials science principles.

The candidate should have an interest in learning to manage highly collaborative research efforts with academics and industrial partners. The candidate will contribute to preparing grant proposals and reports, writing manuscripts, and mentoring graduate and undergraduate students. The position will be available starting immediately. The initial appointment will be for one year, conditionally renewable for an additional period of 1-2 years pending regular progress evaluation and continuity of funding.

QUALIFICATIONS: Ph.D. in chemistry or a related field; strong technical expertise, demonstrated independence in the design and execution of experiments, creativity, ability to work collaboratively with partners across institutions, excellent communication skills, dedication to mentoring and outreach.
